The sin of pride can be a huge obstacle to receiving from God. Repent of your pride and admit your need.



His comfort is always available to us, but many of us refuse this comfort because we think we don't deserve it. God, pouring out His love upon us, has nothing to do with us earning it! He pours out His love because He wants to. He knows we need it!

Now rest. **Let** Jesus wipe away all your sins. **Let** His times of restoration and refreshment come flooding into your soul.

I want you to "get" this totally WOW aspect of Christianity!

Because He loves you, God chooses to forgive you. Because God loves you, He chooses to restore you and to refresh you. You see, when we repent, we're forgiven. When we're forgiven, we're set free from the burdens and guilt of our sin and shame.

Romans 8:1 says, "... there is now no condemnation for those who are in Christ Jesus." Christ did not come to condemn the world but to save it.

Let me share with you an incident from my past that helped me "get" it. I'd sinned, probably something with my pride and/or talking too much. I felt guilty over it. I was tired, probably from worrying about what a mess I'd made. So, I lay down to take a nap and told the Lord, "OK, do with me what You need to do. Spank me, lecture me, whatever. I deserve it." Well, I fell sound asleep. When I woke up, a still, small voice spoke to my heart and said, "I love you; you're forgiven." I lay there, thinking about what had just happened. I thought, I deserved a whipping and God just forgave me, and then He loved me, gave me peace of mind, and it was over.

WOW! May each of you have WOW moments like this!

"Our sins can be shown to us in two very different ways.

In the first place, Satan accuses the saints day and night. Again and again he tells us our sins, until we become quite desperate. He says, 'Now you can see how you really are. That which you have done is completely according to your character, and that will never change.'



REPENTANCE FEELS GOOD

It feels good to repent. How about swimming? Just getting our toes wet at the side of the pool isn't the same. Jumping in over our heads, being totally drenched, is what refreshes us. Repentance is the same. Only when we go all the way, being totally honest with God, do we walk away refreshed and revitalized. Repentance is awesome; it frees us from all the dirty, ugly things sin does to us. Repentance opens our eyes to new attitudes.



Repentance is not just a one-time thing. Because we all sin every day—no matter how hard we try not to—repentance is a perpetual topic in our conversations with the Lord. The first time we repent and turn to God is so huge. At that time, we become Christians. At that time the promises of the Bible become ours.

Even after we accept Christ and want not to sin, we still do. And God knows we do. He just wants us to humble ourselves, swallow our self-righteous pride and admit our sin. He wants us to stop rationalizing away our sins and admit them to Him and come clean. Repentance is a daily process. After we sin and repent, God forgives and restores. We start another day and, sure enough, some sin creeps in. We repent... God forgives and restores. He never gets tired of forgiving us. He knows we won't be perfect until we enter heaven. When we repent, we're just admitting we know we aren't perfect, and God is the only one who can help us. Repentance isn't a demeaning act; it's just us acknowledging that God is God and we are not. Repentance causes humility to grow as we realize that we are who we are and achieve what we achieve because of God. Repentance helps us keep our focus on Jesus Christ.

God wants a relationship with us. He wants to call each of us friend. When we really love someone, we won't do anything to intentionally harm that relationship. In our friendship with God, sin harms the relationship. Repentance is the tool to restore it.

God is our Heavenly Father. He has the right to tell us what to do. His motive in all His commands is to give each of His children the best. Sin hurts us; always. There are no exceptions. Sin hinders God's work in our lives, but every time we repent, the God of love is working everything out for our good. (Romans 8:28)

Repentance is good for us. It feels so good to be clean. When we repent, God refreshes, revitalizes, and restores us with lavish blessings beyond description. The gift of repentance and the mercy and grace of God's forgiveness are too awesome for words.



Romans 8:1-2 says it this way:

"Those who enter into Christ's being-here-for-us
no longer have to live under a continuous, low-lying black cloud.

A new power is in operation.

The Spirit of life in Christ, like a strong wind,
has magnificently cleared the air,
freeing you from a fated lifetime of brutal tyranny
at the hands of sin and death"
